About Today's Service

Many of the readings today were the works of Ann Weems. She was a noted writer, speaker, liturgist and worship leader, and had been called the "Poet Laureate" of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Among her seven published books or collections of poems, meant to be used in worship, in personal devotions, and in discussions, are *Kneeling in Jerusalem*, *Kneeling in Bethlehem* and the best-selling *Psalms of Lament*. She is also the author of the critically-acclaimed poem, *Balloons Belong in Church*, about her then four-year old son, Todd, who brought an orange balloon with pink stripes to church school one Sunday morning.

Ann Barr Weems passed away at the age of 81 on March 17, 2016, in St. Louis, Missouri, where she lived for over fifty years, due to complications from a brain tumor.

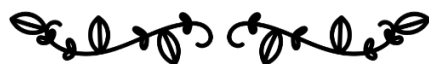
A Quilted Communion Cloth to Celebrate our Sesquicentennial

When you place your donation in the basket, it would be helpful if you would please write the names of the donors on the clipboard near the basket. If you have any questions, please see Sandy Parr.

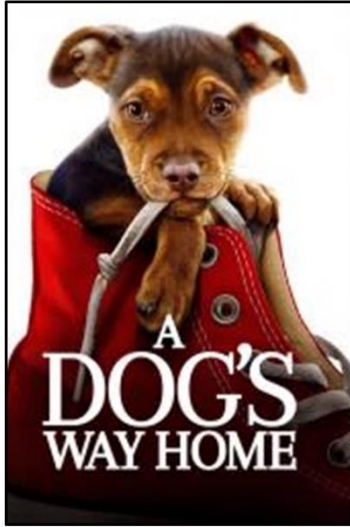
Looking for Pictures and Memories

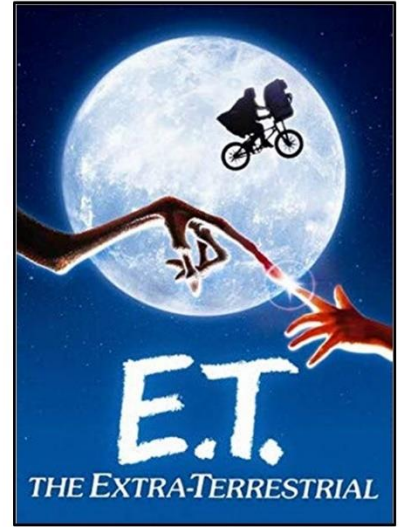
