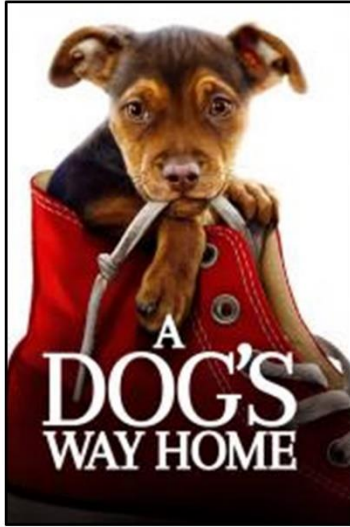
A Quilted Banner to Celebrate our Sesquicentennial

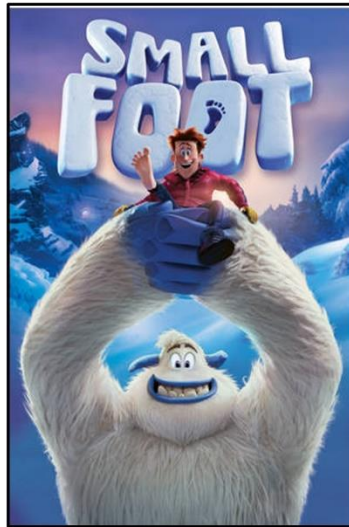

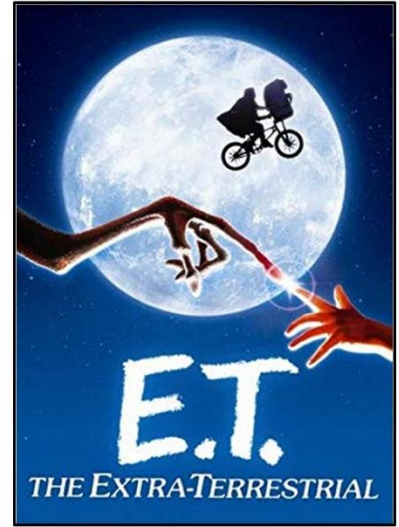
